

We school use Arbor as our 'Management Information System'. This allows parents to log into their parent account to make any updates as necessary, such as a change of telephone number or home address.

Most importantly, we require all parents to complete the 'permissions' section, giving or denying permission for things like photography and trips. Please ensure these sections are completed as soon as possible to allow us to use your child's image and information correctly.

Vital time is saved each morning in class if meals are chosen at home and we strongly encourage all meals (even packed lunches) to be chosen this way. We thank you for your support.

# **Griffydam Primary School**

#### **Nomination for Parent Governor**

There is a vacancy for two parent\* governors to serve on the school's governing body. We are very keen to encourage parents and carers of registered pupils to nominate themselves to become part of our governing body.

Parent governors are elected by other parents and are vital to our governing body. They share equally with other governors the duty of carrying out the governing body's wide range of responsibilities. Governors do not run the school day to day, as their role is at the strategic or policy-making level in the school. They ensure that the headteacher performs his or her responsibilities for the educational performance of the school and ensure the sound, proper and effective use of the school's financial resources.

You do not have to be an expert on education to be a school governor, and we value the experience and skills that all governors bring to the role. However you will be expected to demonstrate skills and experience that will enhance governance at the school, a commitment to undertake training and a willingness to engage in the life of the school and its strategic development. The Governing Body would welcome applications from parents with the following skills/experience:

- financial management
- strategic leader ship and/or board experience
- human resources/learning and development
- · education (not necessarily primary)

If you join our governing body, you will serve for a four-year term and you can continue to the end of the four years even if your child leaves the school. There are four governing body meetings each year and governors usually serve on one or more committees which meet once a term. You will need to set aside time to be able to be an effective governor: time to prepare for meetings, visit the school, and undertake training.

We hope that the governing body reflects the diverse community the school serves, and welcome nominations from people of all backgrounds.

If you would like to take the opportunity to put yourself forward as a candidate please contact Mrs Blake in the office, either in person or via <a href="mailto:office@griffydam.leics.sch.uk">office@griffydam.leics.sch.uk</a> and request an application pack. This will contain further information along with a parent governor election form. Please complete and return the election form to the office by Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September 2023.

If there are more nominations than vacancies the election will be by secret ballot. If that is necessary, voting papers will be sent to all parents together with details of the ballot procedure.

•\* All 'parents', as defined in the School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012, who make themselves known to the school, may stand as parent governors, providing they are not disqualified from holding office.

#### Parents include:

- the parents (natural or adoptive);
- any individual who has or has had 'parental responsibility for, or cares or has cared for, a child or young person under the age of 18;
- a person who the child lives with and who looks after the child, irrespective of what their relationship is with the child e.g. step-father, grandparents, other relatives, cohabitees and foster parents. NB This must be someone involved in the full-time care of the child on a settled basis.
